#### **Eligibility Requirements**

- Must be at least 21 years' old
- Have adequate space in the home to accommodate 1 or more children
- Possess a valid driver's license
- Own a working, inspected and registered motor vehicle
- Be financially stable
- Have clean background checks
- Home is safe and free of of hazards with working smoke detectors
- Agree to home study, including all family members

### Parental Responsibilities

- Respect the child's confidential information
- Provide transportation to all appointments
- Participate in required meetings
- Work with the treatment team to support child's plan
- Be sensitive to the needs of your child and his/her trauma
- Ensure the child is adequately supervised at all times
- Inform caseworkers when and if problems or illness arise

### **Additional Information**

- Fostering a child is completely free
- Fostering can be full or part time
- Currently there are over 5,000 children in the Virginia foster care system, with over 10% ready for adoption
- Support and other post-adoptions resources are available
- Adoption from foster care is permanent
