# The State of Foster Care

Foster care is a vital system that provides temporary homes and support for children who cannot remain with their families due to issues such as abuse, neglect, or parental inability to care for them adequately. As of the latest available data, there are just over 5000 children in Virginia's foster care system. This number represents the children who have been placed in the care of foster families or group homes as a result of factors compromising their safety and well-being. While this number is concerning, it is crucial to understand the reasons behind their entry into the foster care system to be able to address the root causes effectively. By examining the population of children in care, the reasons for their entry, the length of their stays, and the outcomes upon exiting care, we gain insight to inform our programming for the future.

The primary reasons for children entering foster care in Virginia include neglect, abuse, parental substance abuse, parental incarceration, and parental death. Neglect is the leading factor, accounting for over 50% of foster care placements. This underlines the urgent need for interventions and support services aimed at preventing neglect and strengthening families in order to minimize the number of children who require placement in foster care. Often there are multiple factors that lead to neglect, but most frequently it is a lack of adequate family resources that contributes to a child entering foster care. This is something that as a community we can and should address, because the long-term repercussions of the foster care system on children can be grave and costly. Up to 80% of youth in foster care have significant mental health issues as compared to approximately 22% of youth in the general population. Children in foster care also have significantly higher mean physical and behavioral health care costs than those of the overall Medicaid child population—as much as 40% more than their non-foster care peers.

As a means of intervention, Tidewater Friends of Foster Care has begun providing our services to children and families before the need for foster care arises. We do this in partnership with Child Protective Services and Communities in Schools, who identify youth that need additional supports. The prevailing body of research on long-term outcomes shows that children do better when they can be maintained within their family of origin. By working to keep families intact, we are minimizing the detrimental elements of being placed in foster care and helping to lessen the burden on the system as a whole. Foster care is an effective tool to maintain safety of a child, however, that safety does come at an emotional cost, particularly when children remain separated from their families for long periods of time.

Length of stay in foster care is a significant factor impacting the well-being of children. Ideally, the goal is to reunite children with their families as soon as it is feasible and safe. However, if reunification is not possible, other permanency options such as adoption or guardianship are pursued, which can lead to longer times in care. The average length of stay in foster care in Virginia is 20 months. While efforts have been made to reduce this duration and expedite permanency by addressing barriers and providing necessary resources, it is essential to ensure transitions to permanency are safe and lasting for children. To help address this, Tidewater Friends of Foster Care assists in two key ways: (1) by providing emergency needs funding to help families meet the requirements of reunification and (2) by providing our full complement of services for up to 2 years after a child exits foster care, whether that be to their birth family or an adoptive family. Through these initiatives, we are helping to expedite permanent solutions for children and families, while bolstering their stability.

Another significant factor impacting the well-being of children in foster care, is the number of placements they have while in care. In Virginia, over 45% of children have 3 or more placements while in foster care, with 20% of foster youth having 5 or more placements. The constant movement of children within the foster care system inflicts a profound and lasting detriment on their well-being. Each relocation not only disrupts a child's sense of stability and security but also fragments vital connections with caregivers, peers, and educators. The transient nature of their living arrangements hampers the establishment of consistent relationships, hindering the development of trust and emotional bonds crucial for healthy growth.

Moreover, frequent changes in schools can impede academic progress, exacerbating the already considerable challenges these youth face. The detrimental impact of this instability is not merely immediate; it resonates in the long term, affecting their mental health, self-esteem, and ability to form lasting connections. In fact, 90% of foster youth with 5 or more placements encounter the criminal justice system. That is why in every program that we offer at TFFC, stability is the core tenet. We are striving to create a more stable and supportive foster care environment to help mitigate the enduring harm caused by constant upheaval.

The outcomes for children exiting foster care in Virginia vary depending on the stability and support they receive during their time in care. The ultimate aim is to create permanent, loving homes that enable these children to thrive. Currently, around 28% of children exiting foster care in Virginia are reunited with their parents and just under 20% are placed permanently with a relative. This reunification indicates successful efforts to address the causes that led to their placement and provide necessary services to families so they can remain intact. For children who cannot be safely reunited with their families, adoption becomes the next desired outcome. Adoption offers children a stable and nurturing environment to grow and thrive. In Virginia, approximately 30% of children exiting foster care find permanent homes through adoption. Adoption is not the end of the strife from the difficult journey through foster care, though. For many children, struggles with loss and grief persist for years, as does the need for ongoing support. That's why TFFC has expanded our programming for adopted children, to continue our support during the years after adoption is finalized and help strengthen the entire family for the long term.

While the goal is always to achieve permanency in a family setting, it is notable that as much as 20% of children in foster care emancipate or age out of the system each year. Aging out refers to children reaching the age of maturity without finding permanent homes or a support system. This can lead to adverse outcomes, such as higher rates of homelessness, unemployment, and lower educational attainment. One in five youth who emancipate from the foster care system report experiencing homelessness between ages 17 and 19, and as much as 29% report being homeless from 19 to 21. To address this, Virginia has implemented programs and support services to assist youth in transitioning to independent living successfully, but there is much more to be done in this space. That is why TFFC has expanded our service eligibility indefinitely for youth who have aged out of foster care. We are there for them when they need us! With this we demonstrate our commitment to supporting youth on their journey to thriving beyond aging out of the foster care system.

By actively providing support services aimed at strengthening families before children enter foster care, we are helping families stay intact. Through supporting children while in the foster care and after exiting the system, we are working to help improve the overall outcomes of Virginia's foster care system. We are prioritizing interventions as well as services after reunification and adoption, to ensure that children successfully maintain permanency with family and have a better future. Through continued efforts, collaboration, and community support, we can ensure that the state's most vulnerable children receive the stability, care, and love they deserve.



# Our Program Updates

**TUTORING** 

Foster youth face significant challenges when it comes to their educational outcomes. Sadly, they often experience some of the poorest academic results in the nation. In Virginia, only 2 out of 3 youth involved in the foster care system (62%) graduate high school—this compares to a general graduation rate of 92% for all students and a homeless graduation rate of 77% (VA, 2023). By 3rd grade, most foster youth are already one grade level behind in reading and by 11th grade, only 1 out of 5 is proficient in reading and math. With the right academic support, these outcomes can be changed and foster youth can perform on par with or better than their non-foster-care peers. This is our mission and the proven outcome of our tutoring program.

Tidewater Friends of Foster Care is dedicated to making a difference by providing one-on-one, in-home academic support to help these students succeed. We hire the very best instructors, who curate individualized educational support plans and work with students in their homes, so they can establish strong studying skills independent of the classroom environment. Our tutors are highly-qualified, professional educators, contracted competitively to guarantee that our students are getting the best educational services with accountability—our goal is to ensure that our tutors lend not only to academic progress, but also the overall stability of the lives of the children we serve.

We tutor all subjects and grade levels from Pre-K through College, including vocational studies and GED. This support is provided up to 4 hours per week during the school year and up to 6 hours per week over the summer. This program is supported through donations and foundation grants and is provided at no cost to the family or social service agency. We continue to provide our tutoring services to youth even after they have exited foster care for as long as they need academic support.

Through our one-on-one instruction approach, we have witnessed remarkable transformations in the students enrolled in our tutoring program. Not only have we seen improved graduation rates among these youth, but more importantly, we have witnessed a boost in their self-confidence, an expansion of their aspirations, and a collective improvement in their academic performance.

By offering this individualized instruction, we address the specific learning gaps and provide personalized support that foster youth may not receive elsewhere. This targeted approach helps them thrive academically and empowers them to reach their full potential. Our commitment to bridging the educational gap for foster youth goes beyond just academic success. We understand that education plays a crucial role in shaping their future opportunities and overall well-being. By investing in their education through our tutoring program and by providing post-secondary scholarships, we are giving these young individuals a chance at a brighter future.

We are so grateful for all our supporters who have joined us as we make a lasting impact on foster youth's lives by providing them with the tools and support they need to succeed academically. Together, we are creating a path towards improved educational outcomes, increased graduation rates, and enhanced self-confidence for these deserving individuals.



Before he left in December, he knew all his Capital letters, most lowercase letters, and about 10 sight words. He was able to count to 19 before needing assistance to remember how to change over to the next 10. He could also count by 10s and could understand how to add and subtract 1-digit numbers. I built a strong rapport with Chris, he improved his basic readiness skills, and went from hating anything to do with school to loving school.

### Aliyah is 18 years old and is now a high-school graduate!

Remarks from Aliyah's Tutor, Carmen: Beginning in January, Aliyah did not know how to study, she was complacent with her success in math, and was not optimistic of her future grades. By April, Aliyah was able to complete research assignments without assistance, and had begun grasping concepts during math class. Aliyah was a great client, she was very willing to learn and put in practice suggestions to improve her grades. Aliyah graduated and has plans to pursue a license in cosmetology. She also received a \$1000 TFFC Scholarship to help succeed in her post-secondary plans.

This year, in partnership with the Joe Lee Hansley Foundation, 15 of our highschoolers embarked on a group college tour of universities across Georgia and South Carolina. Foster youth experienced not only the thrill of exploring potential academic pursuits but also the empowering sense of possibility. The journey was more than just visits to campuses; it became a transformative exploration of dreams and aspirations and included a fun-filled evening at a Braves game! Navigating the historic halls and vibrant campuses, these resilient young individuals were exposed to a world of opportunities. The group dynamic fostered a supportive environment, allowing them to share aspirations, exchange stories, and envision a future defined by education and personal growth. As they walked the campuses, listened to lectures, and absorbed the unique atmosphere of each institution, the college tour ignited a spark of hope and ambition, affirming that higher education is not just a distant dream but a tangible goal well within reach.

### **OUTREACH**



### **EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES**

Keeping the pipeline full of loving, available foster homes is more important than ever. Even several years later, it remains complicated by the pandemic's impact on children and families, both from the perspective of a general decrease in the capacity of families to step up to foster, and in the challenging behaviors of children entering care from isolation and lack of social development during the pandemic. Children are clearly struggling and so are the parents who care for them. TFFC works hard to recruit, train and support those individuals who raise their hand to foster a child. We also are supporting families of origin to help prevent entry or re-entry into foster care.

This year's Foster Care Aware event was centered around training to equip those working in the field of child welfare, as well as those who foster or are thinking about fostering, with tools that can help improve outcomes for youth in foster care. We partnered with the ATTACh organization and Old Dominion University to create a 2-day symposium that provided top-notch training focusing on trauma-informed parenting and the importance of attachment for children with trauma histories.

Old Dominion University very generously opened their campus to host this year's Foster Care Aware event, where we held educational lectures, a vendor fair, family fun activities, a children's playland, and immersive sensory tools for healing trauma. Day one was geared for professionals—social workers, clinicians, and educators—and day two was geared for parents and families. Informative lectures were held for both groups on attachment, trauma-related behaviors in children, and Trust Based Relational Intervention—a model of care developed by Dr. Karyn Purvis and Dr. David Cross at TCU that works on bolstering secure attachments. The symposium was very successful in bringing a vast array of individuals together to share information and best practices within the foster care system.

On the recruiting side, this event provided information on becoming a foster parent and dovetailed into our Prospective Parent Program—a program that helps guide people through the decision process of becoming a foster parent, providing the emotional support and accountability needed to succeed throughout the process. Through our Prospective Parent Program, parents join a community where they learn skills and tools to help them navigate the system, choose a licensing agency, and connect with other people on similar journeys.

The purpose is to educate parents on the rewards and challenges associated with foster parenting, while supporting them with access to professionals and existing foster parents to help inform and answer questions. Prospective parents are also paired with a personal coach so they can talk through their concerns and fears as they move forward with becoming foster parents. Through providing comprehensive training programs, and offering ongoing support like this, we are working to ensure that every child in need has access to a safe and nurturing environment.

Extracurricular activities for foster youth offer a multitude of benefits that go beyond just having fun. These activities provide a healthy outlet for stress relief, allowing young individuals to unwind and recharge. Engaging in extracurriculars offers children the opportunity to explore new interests, develop life skills and interact with their peers, fostering social connections and enhancing their social skills. Through teamwork, communication, and problem-solving, they learn valuable lessons that will benefit them throughout their lives.

Additionally, research has shown a positive correlation between involvement in extracurricular activities and academic performance. Foster youth who participate in these activities often demonstrate improved focus, time management skills, and discipline—all of which contribute to better performance in the classroom. In fact, studies have even suggested that youth engaged in extracurriculars tend to achieve higher scores on standardized tests such as the SAT.

TFFC is proud to support extracurricular activities for youth in foster care and to date has sponsored

over 1005 separate activities for 463 kids of all ages. From gymnastics to martial arts, and cooking to drum lessons, we've helped foster kids engage in healthy and enriching activities that will benefit them over the long run. In 2023 we supported 235 activities for 135 youth!

As an extension of the amazing benefits that extracurriculars have for our youth, TFFC supports YMCA membership for our youth, families and social workers. Through providing Y memberships, we are making a commitment to fostering holistic well-being for the entire foster care system. YMCA members have access to a myriad of benefits that promote physical health, social connectivity, and personal growth. With access to state-of-the-art fitness facilities, families can embark on a journey towards active living, engaging in a variety of exercise programs suitable for all ages. The YMCA's commitment to community shines through its family-oriented activities and events, providing a platform for bonding and creating lasting memories. The Y is not just a place to exercise; it's a hub for educational resources, childcare services, and character development programs.

We provide these memberships in partnership with the YMCAs of South Hampton Roads, the Virginia Peninsulas, and new this year, the YMCAs of Greater Richmond. This year TFFC sponsored 353 YMCA family memberships for foster youth, social workers and their family members; all told supporting YMCA membership for over 1000 individuals.

We are eternally grateful to our YMCA partners, and all their amazing supporter. The Y's investment in the overall well-being of each family member we serve is fostering a dynamic and thriving foster care community!

Together, we are making a difference by showing these deserving children that they are not alone on their journey.

We send a BIG THANKS to our Friends at Atlantic Union Bank, who donated space at Dominion Tower for this year's Holiday Project, where presents were stacked floor to ceiling and wall to wall for all the youth we serve. It was a sight to behold!

### **CAMPS**

Summer camps play a crucial role in providing foster youth with normative experiences that they may not have had the opportunity to enjoy otherwise. Camps offer a sense of belonging and community, allowing foster youth to connect with their peers and create lasting friendships. One of the key benefits of summer camps for foster youth is the opportunity to feel like a "regular" kid again. In their everyday lives, foster youth may often feel singled out or stigmatized due to their circumstances. However, at summer camps, they are able to blend in with other campers and simply be kids, free from judgment or preconceived notions.

Moreover, camps provide a much-needed outlet for fun and stress relief—and a welcomed respite for parents too! Foster youth often face unique challenges and high levels of stress in their lives. Attending a camp allows them to temporarily escape from these pressures and engage in recreational activities that promote joy, laughter, and personal growth.

Through experiences such as swimming, hiking, arts and crafts, team sports, and campfire gatherings, camps help foster youth develop essential life skills while promoting a sense of independence and self-confidence. And to help make sure that kids who exit foster care still have an opportunity to benefit from all of these enriching experiences, we extended our camp eligibility to cover the summer a child exits foster care, plus the next year too!

In 2023, we sent kids to a record number of camps and they loved it! Through the incredible support of our generous donors, TFFC sponsored 578 camp sessions for 138 campers at 39 different camps across the state —that's a 51% increase from 2022, which was also a record breaker for us. Campers got to experience overnight and day camps including Camp Silver Beach, Camp Red Feather, Art Camp, Paddleboard Camp, Volleyball Camp, and many, many more.

We send a special thanks to the Philbin Family and the E. C. Warehiem Foundation for sponsoring so many of our kids to attend the best camps in Virginia—the true joy these camps have created is remarkable!




# Development & Investment







